

¹³ And after Jesus came into the region of Caesarea of Philippi, he was asking his learners, saying,
“Who are humans saying the Son of Humanity is?”

¹⁴ And they said,
“Some are saying John the Baptist, and others are saying Elijah, and different ones are saying Jeremiah or one of the prophets.”

¹⁵ He is saying to them,
“And you, who are you saying that I am?”

¹⁶ And answering, Simon Peter said,
“You yourself are the Christ, the Son of the living Creator!”

¹⁷ And answering, Jesus said to him,
“Blessed are you, Simon Son-of-Jonah, because flesh and blood did not uncover this to you, but my Father who is in the heavens. ¹⁸ And I myself am saying to you that you yourself are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church and the gates of Hades will not overpower it. ¹⁹ I will give to you the keys of the Kingdom of the Heavens and whatever you might bind upon the earth will be bound in the heavens and whatever you might release upon the earth will be released in the heavens.”

²⁰ Then he ordered the learners so that they might tell no one,
“He himself is the Christ!”

²¹ From then, Jesus began to show his learners that it is necessary for him to go away into Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and ruler-priests and scholars and to be killed and raised up on the third day. ²² And after taking hold of him, Peter began to rebuke him, saying,

“Mercy be upon you, Lord! This will never happen to you!”

²³ And after turning, he said to Peter,

“Get behind me, Satan! You are a scandal to me because you are not focused on the things of the Creator but on the things of humans!”

²⁴ Then Jesus said to his learners,

“If someone wants to come behind me, then he must deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. ²⁵ For whoever might want to save his soul, will lose it. And whoever might lose his soul because of me, will find it. ²⁶ For how will a human be helped if he might gain the whole cosmos but might permanently-damage his soul? Or what will a human give in exchange for his soul? ²⁷ For the Son of Humanity is about to come in the glory of his Father with his messengers and then he will give-back to each according to his practices. ²⁸ Amen, I am saying to you that there are some standing here who will never taste death until they might see the Son of Humanity coming in his Kingdom.”

^{17.1} And after six days, Jesus is taking-along Peter and James and John his brother and is bringing them up to a high mountain by themselves. ² And Jesus was metamorphosed in front of them and his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as the light. ³ And look, Moses and Elijah were seen by them, talking with Jesus. ⁴ And responding, Peter said to Jesus,

“Lord, it is beautiful for us to be here! If you are wanting, then I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.”

⁵ And while he is still speaking, look, a bright cloud overshadowed them. And look, a voice from the cloud was saying,
“This is my loved Son, I think-well of him. You must listen to him!”

⁶ And after hearing this, the learners fell upon their faces and were extremely scared. ⁷ And Jesus came to them and, while touching them, he said,

“Get up and do not fear.”

⁸ And after lifting up their eyes, they saw no one except him—only Jesus. ⁹ And while they are coming down from the mountain, Jesus commanded them, saying,

“Tell no one about this vision until the Son of Humanity has been raised from the dead.”

¹⁰ And the learners asked him, saying,

“Why then are the scholars saying that it is necessary for Elijah to come first?”

¹¹ And answering, he said,

“Elijah is coming and will restore all things. ¹² And I am saying to you that Elijah already came and they did not know him but did with him whatever they wanted. And like this, the Son of Humanity is about to suffer by means of them.”

¹³ Then the learners understood that he spoke to them about John the Baptist.

- ¹⁴ And after coming to the crowd, a man came to Jesus, kneeling before him ¹⁵ and saying,
“Lord, have mercy on my son because he is mentally-ill and is suffering harm. For he is often falling into the fire and often into the water. ¹⁶ And I brought him to your learners and they were not able to heal him!”
- ¹⁷ And answering, Jesus said,
“Oh unfaithful and twisted generation! How long will I be with you? How long will I endure you? Bring him here to me!”
- ¹⁸ And Jesus rebuked him and the demon came out from him and the servant-child was healed from that hour. ¹⁹ Then after coming to Jesus by themselves, the learners said,
“Why were we ourselves not able to throw out the demon?”
- ²⁰ And he is saying to them,
“Because of your little-faith. For amen, I am saying to you, if you might have faith like a grain of mustard, then you will say to this mountain, ‘Move from here to there!’ and it will move. And nothing will be impossible for you. ²¹ And this kind is not coming-out except with prayer and fasting.”
